



2023 SUMMER GRADUATE FINANCIAL AID APPLICATION – Health Professions Students (Excluding Medical Students)

Please complete all sections of this form and Return to Student Financial Services <u>at the campus location you are attending</u>.

Summer funding is limited. Student Financial Services will award funds on a first come, first serve basis until funds are depleted.

Financial aid eligibility is based on application information provided during the Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 academic year. In order to be considered for summer 2023 financial aid students must meet federal and university aid eligibility requirements, listed on the Student Financial Services website sfs.temple.edu.

Keep in mind that your eligibility for all types of summer student aid (i.e. Federal Direct Loan) will be limited if you have already used your eligibility during the Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 semesters therefore, you may not be eligible for additional funds from that aid program during the Summer 2023 session(s). Federal Direct Loan eligibility and annual loan limit information is available on the reverse side of this form.

If you have not exhausted your annual Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan eligibility for 2022-2023, we will award your remaining eligibility up to cost of attendance. If you do not have remaining eligibility for Federal Unsubsidized Loan funding, you may wish to consider borrowing a Graduate PLUS Loan.

Eligibility Requirements:

- 1. Eligibility for Summer 2023 assistance of any kind requires that you file a 2022-2023 and/or a 2023-2024 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). If you have not already done so, please file your application on-line at https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa as soon as possible.
- First time Federal Direct Loan borrowers are required to complete an Entrance Interview and a Master Promissory Note at www.studentloans.gov. Borrowers of the Graduate PLUS loan will be required to complete a credit check.
- Students must also meet financial aid and academic progress requirements. Enrollment Requirement:

- Graduate students must be enrolled at least half time (minimum 4.5 credit hours) to be considered for federal loan funding. Dissertation students please see your graduate department.
- 2. For Federal Work-Study you must be enrolled at least half time (minimum 4.5 credit hours) and/or pre-registered at least half-time for Fall 2023 (4.5 credits). NOTE: If you are NOT enrolled during Summer 2023 you must have both a 2022-2023 and a 2023-2024 FAFSA on file to establish eligibility.
- If you change your enrollment, it may affect the amount of the Federal Direct Loan or Graduate PLUS Loan you receive or your eligibility to participate in the Federal Work-Study Program.

Important Notice

Students participating in the summer 2023 Federal Work Study program can begin working on May 15, 2023. Summer 2023 Federal Work Study payroll will end on August 11, 2023.

Regulations governing Federal Work Study (FWS) require a portion of summer earnings be used to meet educational expenses during the following academic year if you do not attend Summer classes at least half-time. These attributed earnings (as called by regulation) are considered a resource offsetting calculated need.

The amount is determined using the formula:

Gross summer earnings

- taxes
- job related expenses

= Attributable earnings

Example: a graduate commuter student with gross Summer FWS earnings of \$2,300.00 is expected to contribute \$1,274.00 from these earnings toward 2023-2024 educational expenses. The computation of attributed earnings for this student is as follows:

Federal Direct Loans will be available if you are an eligible student and have not received the maximum amount of Federal Direct Subsidized/Unsubsidized Loan eligibility during the previous Fall and Spring semesters.

Graduate PLUS Loan 2022-2023

Students can borrow up to the Cost of Education for Summer 2023 less other aid and resources. The Cost of Education is determined by adding together tuition costs, estimated living expenses, and estimated personal expenses and varies by educational program.
